

## **Older Population in Wales**




#### PROPORTION OF OLDER PEOPLE IN WALES BY POLICE FORCE AREA



Police data




A dwelling was the most commonly recorded assault location. Other assault locations included street, residential institute, retail, medical centre and open public spaces.



There was a nearly equal split between the number of victims who were female, and those who were male.


Two thirds of offenders were male.



35-44 year olds made up the highest number of offenders.







Admissions data





The most common type of assault resulting in admittance was bodily force, followed by neglect and abandonment, sharp object assault and blunt objects.

Males made up the majority of assault admittances to hospitals across Wales.



Over a third of admittances were for those aged 65-69. Approximately 2% were aged 90 and over.






Almost half of call-outs were for patients aged 75+.


There was a nearly equal divide in the number of call outs for males and females.





More calls were received between 6pm and 8 pm, on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.






Almost half of ED attendances were patients aged 65-69.

2% were patients aged 100 or older.

Males made up the majority of ED assault attendances to hospitals across Wales. Significantly less females attended EDs in North Wales Police force area.






